

Flávio R. Wagner is Emeritus Professor in Computer Science and Engineering at UFRGS (“Universidade Federal do Rio Grande do Sul”), one of the top universities in Brazil, in the city of Porto Alegre. As an active researcher in this field, he was elected as President of SBC – Brazilian Computer Society, for two terms, from 1999 to 2003, and held relevant positions in national research funding agencies.

He is very active in technology and policy arenas both at the national and international levels. He is the current President of the Brazilian Chapter of the Internet Society, in his second term. He is also the permanent Chair of the Programme Committee of the Brazilian IGF (“Fórum da Internet no Brasil”), since 2017, and a lecturer at the Brazilian Internet Governance School.

He was a Board member of CGI.br – Brazilian Internet Steering Committee, for three terms, from 2008 to 2017, and also a Board member of NIC.br – Brazilian Network Information Center, for two terms, from 2013 to 2017. He is still a very active collaborator with both CGI.br and NIC.br, as a technical consultant.

He was a member of the MAG – Multistakeholder Advisory Group, from 2015 to 2017, and also of the Executive Multistakeholder Committee of NetMundial, in 2014. He attended all editions of the IGF – Internet Governance Forum since 2012, and is also active at the LACIGF – Latin American and Caribbean IGF.
